Introduction: This is a short course of eight lessons designed to help students, mentors, and instructors understand the importance of mentoring and how the mentoring program at ASM works. It covers such important questions as ...

1. Why is the mentoring program so significant to the student's education, spiritual formation, and acquisition of ministry skills?
2. What is the biblical background to leadership and mentoring?
3. What are mechanics of the actual mentoring process?

Course Structure:

1. This course is mandatory for all Certificate and Master's degree students and all ASM faculty members. It is typically taken in the first or second semester in which the student enrolls or the faculty member teaches. It only needs to be taken once and there is no cost for instructors. Students will pay the regular tuition and fees which apply.
2. Students and faculty members enrolled in the course will receive all course materials from the instructor. Included in the materials are the curriculum, pre- and post-course surveys, and course study questions. Students should provide their mentors with copies of these materials.
3. Students and participating faculty members will participate in an initial teleconference where the instructor will explain the mechanics of the course and the mentoring program. All teleconferences for this course will be via WebEx®. Mentors are strongly encouraged to attend this meeting.
4. Students will meet with their mentors at least six times. Students and their mentors will go over the mentoring course materials and complete the study questions at the end of the mentoring course booklet. The answers to these will be submitted to the instructor not later than May 15th. **Point Value for Students: 15 points each, 90 points total.**
5. There will be a final wrap-up teleconference with the instructor. This meeting is required for all students and participating faculty members. Mentors are strongly encouraged to attend.
6. The students and their mentors and faculty members will submit their pre-course survey no later than February 15th. **Point Value for Students: 5 points.** They will submit their post-course survey no later than May 15th. **Point Value for Students: 5 points. PLEASE NOTE:** The mentor's completion of the surveys is included in the student's grade. It is in the student's best interest to ensure that his/her mentor submits the survey. Students are reminded that their Mentoring Covenant and Mentoring Information Worksheet are due to the registrar no later than May 15th.
7. The course is evaluated on a Pass/Fail basis. Total points necessary to pass: 70.
